RESPECTED GUARDIANS

Teachers, students and guardians are inter-related in the field of education and pedagogy. In past times, guardians were considered as guests or expense bearers of the students and the school. Ideas such as these have become past history with the passage of time. Guardians are no longer expense bearers or just any other person. Rather they are considered as an integral and vital participator in the world of education. Their ideas and advice and information of a child's behavior and attitude at home helps the teacher to understand the student better and makes it easier for the teacher to teach the child.

Learning does not have any boundaries. School is just an institutional figure in the process of learning. Making the use of modern methods of teaching, an institution creates awareness and eagerness in a child to know more. Institutions, teaching the various artistic beauties of knowledge and learning, may be organized anywhere in the World. A child's home is one such kind of an institution. Guardians, being the teachers at home, also explore and experience new behavior and eagerness in a child as does a teacher at school. These experiences at home and school need to be exchanged every now-and-then among guardians and teachers.

To successfully educate a child, schools arrange meetings between guardians and teachers to share their experiences and exchange their views. Conscious guardians give great importance to such meetings. Not just that, they also maintain a constant touch with the school at their own will. When the child is in the center of a two sided effort not only do they produce a good result, but also grow up to be well mannered and well educated, i.e., a complete human being.

Every school has some rules and regulations for its smooth and successful functioning. As such, this institution has set forward some rules and regulations for instant implementation. These rules are to be sincerely honored by students, teachers and guardians. We are of the opinion that guardians must be made aware of these rules and regulations. We strongly believe that the guardians' co-operation regarding these rules will help us to provide a good atmosphere for the best education to our wards.

Following are some of the rules and regulations presented for your convenience:

- 1. Classes will be started at 8:30am, and student's reporting time will be at 8:15am. After 8:35am the students will not be allowed in the classes
- 2. No child will be allowed to leave the campus during school hours. If a guardian wishes to take a child during school hours, an application to the Principal, stating valid reason(s) have to be submitted.
- 3. School tuition fees must be paid by the guardians. If fees are paid through their Wards, guardians will be responsible for any loss of money.
- 4. Monthly tuition fees must be paid within the 10th of every running month. Those who fail to pay tuition fees by 10th of each month have to pay a fine of Tk.5 per day up to the date of payment.

All the payments must be done at the COMMERCIAL BANK OF CEYLON PLC (Narayanganj Brunch).

- 5. Besides the scheduled Parent's Day, it is often found necessary to discuss important matters with the guardians regarding their ward(s). For this, the Coordinator of the respective segments (PG-F3, I-V, VI-IX, 'O' & 'A' Level) will call upon the guardians to meet them personally. Since the Coordinator will be meeting other guardians on the same day, it is necessary for guardians to meet them at the specified time.
- 6. Students not coming in complete uniform (shirt, pant, skirt, salwar-kameez, shoes, socks, ID card, and tie) will not be allowed to enter the school. As such, they have to return home. Reasons provided by students for not being in uniform will not be taken into account.
- 7. Proper attention in class and regular revision at home bring good results for a student. This practice eliminates the necessity of home tutors. Even then, if a child is found to be weak in his / her studies, the school authority has decided to provide long term coaching for them. This facility is from Level I onwards. A nominal fee will have to be paid for the coaching classes.
- 8. Homework is an integral part of academic learning. Parents must go through their ward's diary and make sure that their H/W is done accordingly. The diaries must be signed by the parents on completion of their ward's H/W. if it is not signed, it will be understood that H/W is incomplete. if so, parents must send a note in the diary, with valid reason(s), why it was not or could not be done. They may also come in person to talk to the Coordinator or the subject teacher.
- 9. Students must participate in all the project work, CT's and term exams. No student will be allowed to sit for class test(s) missed during the revision classes just before the term exams. To earn promotion to the next class, students must have an average mark of 60% in each subject.
- 10. We strongly believe that all students are equal participants and are of equal status in the school. Children have very tender heart and mind. Inconvenient behavior by guardians regarding their ward(s) is strictly prohibited as it creates a negative impression in the child's heart and mind.
- 11. Doctor's certificate must be shown by a student for being absent for 3 (three) consecutive days. If absence is not due to medical reasons, the guardian must come in person and provide satisfactory explanation to the Principal.
- 12. Absentation from class without proper reason(s) is against the rules of the institute. If a student is found to be absent from the institute for 15 (fifteen) days at a stretch without informing the authority, the student's admission will be terminated. The student may be re-admitted on payment of an additional one month fee along with the fee of the running month, subject to approval by the Principal.
- 13. If a student has to go on emergency leave, guardians must have the leave approved by the Principal through proper application.

N.B.: For further clarification of the rules and regulations, students and guardians are advised to consult with respective coordinator. The Principal may be consulted if necessary.



FOR STUDENTS TO REMEMBER

- 1. All activities not related to the institute are strictly prohibited.
- 2. For any activity that disrupts the discipline of the institute the student will be given an initial warning by the authority. Repetition of offence will lead to notification to the parents. Third time offence will lead to punitive measures against the student as deemed suitable by the institute to maintain its discipline and goodwill. In case of serious offences punitive measures will be taken at the instant on discussion between the authority and the parents.
- 3. All directives and notices, written or oral, given by the authority have to be followed by the students.
- **4.** No student will be allowed to attend the classes without proper uniform.
- 5. Absentation from class without proper reason(s) is against the code of conduct of the institute. If a student is found to be absent from the institute for 15 (fifteen) days at a stretch without informing the authority, the student's admission will be terminated. The student may be readmitted on payment of an additional one month fee along with the fee of the running month.
- **6.** Students must arrive in school within 08:10 a.m. to attend the school assembly. School gates will be closed at 08:30 a.m. Students will be not allowed in the class after this time.
- 7. If a student is found to have not completed his/her CW or HW he/she will be detained in school after school hours to complete the unfinished work.
- **8.** It is compulsory for students to attend all class tests (CT's) and term exams.
- **9.** All test and exam papers will be provided for inspection to guardians and students after the exams are held. These must be returned to the class teacher after inspecting them in the school campus.
- **10.** All rules and regulations stated in the diary must be followed.
- 11. Students (boys and girls) are strictly prohibited against wearing gold ornaments. Students will not bring anything to school that is not academic related (CD's, mobiles, story or comic books, etc.). Students will not carry more than Tk. 50 BDT (fifty taka) cash in school. Dyeing of hair (boys and girls) is strictly prohibited.
- **12.** The institute will not be responsible for anything that is lost by the student. If missing property is immediately reported, the concerned authority / teacher will take necessary measures for the recovery of the lost material.
- 13. Students will be fined for any kinds of damage done to school property.
- 14. Students are pledge bound for the upkeep of their studies and the institute's dignity and discipline.
- 15. Students are bound to attend all programs and competitions of the institute.
- **16.** Students must inform the school authority of any adverse fact(s), such as tugging, smoking, encouraging others to take up bad habits, etc., concerning their classmate or fellow student.
- 17. Students must always remember that they may differ from their fellow students in terms of intelligence and talent but they are all equal in terms of humanity. All students are equal participants in the uplift and boost of the school.
- 18. Students must remember that they are to respect the custom and belief of their fellow students. They MUST NOT discriminate themselves on the basis of religion class or status. They must not share or force to share things, especially food, with others which are prohibited (religiously or customarily).
